Jim Corbett's Kumaon


This March, walk the forests

Hunter. Naturalist. **Writer.** Conservationist.


*This journey traces the land that

Beyond the National Park, beyond the Safari.




We explore: • Kath-ka-Naula •

Drive through jungle roads.


Pause where encounters once unfolded.
